

### DUBOIS AREA SHRINE CLUB STEPHANIE GRAHAM'S STORY at ERIE SHRINERS HOSPITAL

On June 19, 1997, Stephanie Graham was born into this world. A great occasion it should have been. It was dis-

covered however that she was born with a club foot and hip dysplasia. Actually, both feet were affected, although her left foot seemed to correct pretty much on its own.

At 2 weeks old, her right foot was placed in a cast at Pittsburgh Children's Hospital. She was also placed in a harness with a bar between her knees and correction shoes. Following the preliminary diagnosis, it was determined that Stephanie would not be able to run or do things such as gymnastics or running that required the use of both feet. Enter her grandfather Lemuel Hollen who was a Free & Accepted Mason and was aware of some of the treatments that were available at Shriners Hospitals. He recommended that the family look into Erie Shriners Hospital. Her parents, Steve and Trudy, followed up on that advice and met with a Dr. Tavares who delayed his retirement to work with Stephanie when she was 14 years old. Prior to going to Erie, the family took Stephanie to the Altoona Jaffa Clinic. Over the following months, Trudy's car broke down, winter set in, and still with 3 kids, she made weekly trips to Erie for 10 months for appointments. There were times when they rode with the Roadrunners.

To start, her right foot was broken and turned so that it was in its normal position. Tendons were moved so that the one pin was put in the top of the foot and an incision was made all around the foot. This was done so that the foot would heal properly. In 7th grade, screws were placed in the left knee so that it would slow the growth of the leg and let the right one catch up. At birth, the left leg was longer than the right one. One screw in the left knee kept popping out so another surgery was done to put a longer screw in. She learned to walk with a cast on her right foot.

As Stephanie continued to grow, she decided to play soccer but often fell a lot when she was little. She played midget football one year and was in cheerleading for 9 years. Finally, in 7th grade, she tried running sports and played soccer in 8th, 9th, and 10th grades. She did a little bit better this time around but it still wasn't what she wanted. As a Sophomore, she tried cross county and was on her way. That season the DAHS girls won the District 10 Title and took 8 girls to States with Stephanie being one of them. The coaches for that team were Head Coach Tom Shade, Mr. Craig and Mr. Gordon. Mr. Craig took over as Head Coach for Stephanie's senior year and the girls again qualified for States winning District 9 and 10.


Stephanie didn't really think it was a big deal, but it was and she wanted

now to prove a lot of people wrong. Among her accomplishments was an undefeated season in 2014; 1 of 3 DAHS girls to qualify for States in 10th grade; 1 of 2 in 11th grade; and 4th place overall at Districts. She was an overall 3 time State Qualifier for Cross Country.

She also ran 400 meter and 800 meter relays for the DAHS Girls Track team. Scott Sullivan is the Head Coach for that team. The sprinters and long distance train together, so Stephanie had the opportunity to do both. In her freshman season of 2012, Stephanie was MVP of mid-distance track. In 2012-2013-2014, she made All District Track and was a State Qualifier in Cross Country. She was District 9 runner up in the 800 meter run in 2013, 2013, 2014 and was 5th in 2015. In 2015 track, her relay team was 1st in District 9 in the 400 meter relay and 3rd in the 800 meter. They were runner up in the Brookville Invitational 4 years in a row from 2012 to 2015. The highlight of her high school years came in 2014 and 2015 when she was voted MVP for all Girls Sports as she participated in Soccer, Gymnastics, Swimming, Cross Country, and Track and Field.

Stephanie has excelled when many would have quit and walked away. She is continuing her education and career possibilities at Clarion University of PA and hopes to participate in both Track and Cross Country there. Her disabilities have at this point prevented her from one of her goals, that of entering the Military. Not giving up however, she is trying again through ROTC. We will let you know about that effort. My guess is that she'll succeed.

### 141st Annual Imperial Session—Shriners International Houston, Texas ~ July 5-9, 2015 A Report on Shrine Business by Representative Emeritus, Fred Imler, Sr., P.P.



As the meeting opened, the usual formalities take place with sessions governed by Roberts Rules of Orders and various appointments are announced. The reports of the standing committees are given. I have served on the Standing Committee for over 20 years.

The report of the Credentials Committee listed those gualified to vote: Elected 644; Emeritus 71; Advitum 16; At Large 13; Colorado Reps 525.

We now have new leadership at the Home Office in Tampa with John McCabe as Executive Vice President. He was given credit for his outstanding leadership along with Vice President Gene Demorea.

We have a new Oversight Committee that reviews fundraising events and reports on the bottom line. The cost to fund the float in the Rose Bowl Parade totaled out at \$149,000 but was viewed by thousands at the parade and millions on TV. The FedEx Las Vegas Open had expenses of nearly \$4,266,000 in 2013; and expenses of \$4,350,000 in 2014. There were 1000 volunteers from 37 states and 249 Shriners from 39 Shrine Centers.

I'm certain that we have all seen the new videos about the success stories of some of our children. The fundraising portion has been very successful with Direct Mail raising \$3.3 million and another \$3.2 million from online pledges was received. Our Headquarters received about 28,000 calls from individuals pledging to have \$19.00 per month charged to their credit cards. Some individuals even agreed to commit to a higher amount per month which resulted in an average overall commitment of \$24.75.

Imperial Sir Doug Maxwell gave the Hospital report. During 2009, there was talk of closing 5 or 7 hospitals but changes in those hospitals to Same Day Surgery facilities has reduced costs and they're doing well led by the success of our Erie Unit. Also starting during this time of reevaluation, over-staffing in the hospitals was reduced with new procedures and the change to the very latest in new equipment. E.O.S, a new full body scan with about 10% of the radiation of an X-ray; Gait Labs to diagnose the problem of patient's walking; new Prosthetic Labs to produce our braces, etc. at the regional facilities. In the Mid-Atlantic, they are done in Philadelphia.

Since we began accepting Third Party pay, we have received \$450 million in income. Before the changes, the average cost to treat a patient was \$10,000.00 while outside hospitals were costing about \$3900.00 per patient.

heavily on our Endowment Fund at \$180 million from invest-

ments. During the past year, we have reduced that number to a deficit of \$72 million. Many of these accomplishments are a result of a Strategic Plan of 78 changes to improve our mission. We hope that through the new plan and new means of fundraising we expect to have a balanced budget by 2018. Our hospitals got a superior rating from US News and World Report. The Hospital in Hawaii was rated the Best Place in the Islands to work. Our new Canadian Hospital is scheduled for dedication on August 20, 2015.

Our research continues as one of the very best at over \$30 million annually. Can you believe that we treat the fetus in the womb? Also, we treat metabolic bone disease, Marjec rod implanted in the spine without the need for surgery to lengthen the rod it is done with a very heavy magnet to lengthen the rod.

Candidates for Imperial Outer Guard were elected. We had 2 candidates: James Ed Stolze (511) and Richard G Burke (212). As a result, Stolze will be Imperial Sir in 2025. Another item to be supported was the Imperial Potentate's Rulings & Decisions.

We had our patient ambassadors visit to tell of their experiences; Joe Wertinger and Katie Ladlee are two outstanding former patients. We now have collaboration with Mayo Clinic to share research and successful new procedures. We were happy to hear the Founder of the Mayo Clinic was a Shriner. We strive to together determine the right care to the right person at the right time.

A new Shriner Reward Card with discounts from businesses is available for Shriners Families & Friends. The Sports Report of 31 Shrine Bowl Football Games raised \$739.000: 72 Golf Tournaments raised \$978.000: 170 sporting events raised \$1,640,000. A golf outing for the new Montreal Hospital raised \$504,000.

The election for the CEO of Shriners Hospital for Children, results with 1272 eligible to vote and 978 voted: Imperial Sir Dale Stauss -500 and Imperial Sir Doug Maxwell – 478. Doug had been CEO for six years.

Numerous checks were presented including the Q for \$28,000; the Oriental Band for \$43,000 and numerous Shrine Center contributions. Future sessions scheduled for the 142<sup>nd</sup> meeting in Tampa; the 143<sup>rd</sup>/144<sup>th</sup> will be in Daytona Beach and the 145<sup>th</sup> will be in Nashville.

Listed on the Call for the Annual Session were 22 items to be voted on by representatives, with 3 being withdrawn from consideration. Two other Shrine Centers requested they be part of the group previously approved to elect members based on a written ballot if the candidate receives 51% of the votes. 4 Shrine centers requested permission to relocate to a new location.





No. 13 failed.

A resolution by the officers and nobility of Hikmat Shriners UD Cuiaba Mato Grosso Brazil to have their charter granted was approved. I might say a very energetic group of nobles. Their attendance at meetings is required as some lodges have monthly dues of \$75 to \$100 per month is quite an obligation. The Fraternity is alive and well in Brazil and Demolay has substantially more members than the United States.

The following is a list of items passed:

Item# 1— Per Capita Tax Passed. Proposed Per Capita portion of dues to be increased; resulting in a \$15.00 dues increase.

Item# 2— Per Capita Tax Withdrawn. Proposed to raise Per Capita \$5.00 per year for 3 years; dues would increase \$5.00 each year for the next 3 years. Without a dues increase, the Fraternal Corp would be broke in the two years. A \$5.00 increase would solve nothing and without an operating cushion.

This \$15.00 increase would be equal to only 4 cents a day which would be the cost of one bottle of water per month. But take a minute to really think about where we're at. No one wants to think about an increase in dues, but as a member of the World's Greatest Philanthropy we have improved the lives of over a million children. Our research program gives us the ability to treat children with problems that in years past had no possibility of survival. Consider 1 bottle of water per month to have the satisfaction of making a better life for a child.

Item #3 – 211.2 Temple Dispensations--Passed.

-- 211.3 Temple Charters --- The fee for Temple Dispensations would be increased to \$1000, and the fee for Temple Charters would be increased to \$1500.

Item #6 -- Stated Meetings--Passed – The Imperial Potentate would have authority to grant a special dispensation to change the location of a temple's annual meeting.

Item #7 -- Stated Meetings – Passed – The Imperial Potentate would have the authority to grant a special dispensation for a temple to allow participation in any meeting electronically.

Item #8 – Treasurer – Passed. The Treasurer would have the duty to either complete or arrange for completion of all financial documentation required to be filed by the temple.

Item #9 – Initiation Waivers – Passed. When a shrine temple receives a request for a waiver of jurisdiction from another shrine temple to initiate a candidate, it would be incumbent on that shrine temple to act upon that waiver at their next stated meeting. Failure to do as such would automatically grant such waiver to the requesting shrine temple.

Item #10 – Dues—Passed. A Noble holding a demit could affiliate with a temple within the jurisdiction of which he is and for at least 6 months has been an actual resident or with the temple nearest to his actual place of residence.


Item #12 – Mahi Shriners—Passed. Mahi Shriners would no longer have jurisdiction in the Republic of Honduras or in the country of Peru, and Miami-Dade county be correctly identified.

Item #14 – Cyprus Shriners – Passed. Cyprus Shriners would no longer have jurisdiction in the country of Jamaica.

Item #16 -- Anezeh Shriners – Passed. Anezeh Shriners would have exclusive jurisdiction in the Republic of Honduras.



### SHC-Erie Launches Drive For New C-arm

Shriners Hospitals for Children–Erie has em-barked on a major program to upgrade its aging C-arm machines.

A mobile C-arm is a medical imaging device that utilizes X-ray technology and is used in the ORs in the ASC, Clinic and Radiology for various proce-dures. The C-arm gets its name from the C-shaped arm used to

connect the X-ray source to the X-ray detector.

Mobile imaging systems have become an es-sential part of everyday healthcare. Specialists in sur-gery and orthopaedics use C-arms for intraoperative imaging. The C-arm provides -resolution X-ray images in real time. This gives the physician the abil-ity to monitor progress at any point during an opera-tion and immediately make any corrections that may be required. Subsequently, treatment outcomes are improved and patients recover more quickly.

The newest C-arm technology is able to cap-ture a clearer image all while moving the C-arm or patient. This allows for a superb image with the first exposure, resulting in no need for re-takes and repeated exposure. Upgrading to the latest digital mobile C-arm technology will allow bet-ter radiation dose management, especially for the children cared for at SHC-Erie.

This new C-arm equipment will enhance SHC-Erie's ability to continue providing the highest quality care to children with musculoskeletal conditions and other special health care needs.

Shrine temples, clubs and units are invited to help make this project become a reality by supporting SHC-Erie's efforts to raise the \$300,000 needed to purchase and utilize this new piece of equipment in support of the thousands of children who annually receive care here.



### Physician Brings Both Knowledge and Gratitude to Board of Governors

Honored to Serve His Philanthropy



As an orthopaedic surgeon, Jack Rocco, M.D., obviously brings an important, and needed, medical understanding and perspective to the Board of Governors of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia. He is currently serving his third year as a board member, and said he considered just being asked to apply for this position a "great honor."

In addition to his medical knowledge, Dr. Rocco also brings a deep understanding of the power of Shriners and Shriners Hospitals for Children to give families hope.

#### A STORY OF GRATITUDE

Dr. Rocco's connection to Shriners Hospitals for Children is an intensely personal story of a family that remains grateful to Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children decades after help was given to a loved one. In 1946, long before Dr. Rocco was born, his (future) aunt contracted polio and was admitted to Zem Zem Shriners Hospital (now Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie Ambulatory Surgery Center and Outpatient Specialty Care Center) in Erie, Pa.

"My grandparents were a very young Italian immigrant couple who were devastated when their oldest daughter was afflicted with polio, and were always grateful for the generosity and care the Shriners provided during this very difficult time."

Eventually, Dr. Rocco attended college in Pittsburgh, followed by medical school at Temple University in Philadelphia. His internship and residency

at Temple University Hospital included a six month stint at the Shriners Hospital in Philadelphia.

"My family was overjoyed when I had the opportunity to work in the Philadelphia hospital as a resident," he said.

After completing his education and serving in the military, Dr. Rocco settled in Altoona, Pa., and began both a family and a medical practice.

"One day, I had a patient who I noticed was wearing a Shriners ring. When I asked him how I would go about joining the Shriners fraternity, he was very gracious and agreed to sponsor me."

Dr. Rocco became a member of Jaffa Shriners in Altoona, Pa., that October. His involvement grew slowly over the years – today he is a member of Provost Guard, Legion of Honor, Order of Quetzalcoatl and Royal Order of Jesters. And of course, he serves the philanthropy as a board member.

#### GRATITUDE LEADS TO MEMBERSHIP AND GIVING BACK

"Many people ask me about being an orthopaedic surgeon on the board and I do believe this gives me a unique perspective on the inner workings of the hospital but I feel my history of having a family member who was treated at Shriners Hospitals is equally important," said Dr. Rocco. "Because of the Shriners and the physicians at the hospital, my aunt, despite her residual disabilities, lived a full life. She worked, married, and raised two children, several grandchildren and great-grandchildren. One of her daughters and a grandson also eventually worked at the Shriners Hospital in Erie."

Appreciation, gratitude and respect for the Shriners organizations continue to be part of the fabric of the Rocco family to this day.

"There is no question in my mind that our respect for the Shriners and the Shriners health care system led us to accept these positions as a way for us to give back for everything that was done for my aunt and our family," said Dr. Rocco.

"Each month I leave the OR after work on a particular Wednesday and drive four hours from Altoona to Philadelphia for the meeting on Thursday morning. Each month I'm humbled by being able to contribute in a small way to the administrative decisions of the hospital."

### Meet Jalen

Jalen Castle is 13 years old from Columbia, S.C. and a lifelong golfer. It has been her passion since learning to play at the age of 2. She excels in her school her favorite class is language arts. In addition to her studies, she was awarded the 2014-15 South Carolina High School All-State Girls Golf Team. As a seventh grader, she made the high school varsity team. In June 2014, Jalen was diagnosed with scoliosis, a 58 degree curvature of the spine. Her family was seeking an alternative to a spinal fusion, after searching the internet they learned about Shriners Hospitals for Children—Philadelphia, and the anterior vertebral body tethering procedure. On April 8, 2015, Amer Samdani, MD, chief of surgery performed the procedure. A mere six weeks after her surgery Jalen was back out swinging a golf club thanks to the surgery she received at Shriners Hospitals for Children.

### Arthrogryposis Awareness

On Tuesday, June 30, staff, patients and families all wore blue to recognize Arthrogryposis Awareness Day.

The Philadelphia Shriners Hospital orthopaedic surgeon Dr. vanBosse is a recognized expert in the care and treatment of children with arthrogryposis. Sometimes, when babies aren't able to move around in the womb, they develop



arthrogryposis, a medical description indicating the presence of contractures at birth, affecting more than one body part. Arthrogryposis is rare; it is indicated in one of 3-4,000 births.

"Many parents who come to us have been told horrific things; they've heard the worst case scenario – often including that their child will never walk," said Dr. Harold vanBosse. "There is a lot of potential in these kids. We spend an intense amount of time with the patient and families and then tell the parents the steps that need to be taken to help their child. And we hope for the best.

"We look at what's possible. There's nothing more exciting than seeing a child walk for the first time. Of course, walking isn't everything – but if it's possible, it's a great thing."
