Every week our two Jaffa hospi-Shrine Club van log hundreds of miles traveling to Erie, Philadelphia and Cincinnati Shriners

hospitals. Each trip requires two roadrunners to make the trip. Many miles and a lot of "noble" man hours go into our labor of love.

Some trips begin and end at Jaffa. Many start at the home of the patient. Usually just one parent makes the trip with the child. Several roadrunners have been known to make a trial run to the home of a patient a few days before if they are not familiar with the location. Finding a rural home in the hills of Central Pennsylvania isn't always the easiest thing to do in the predawn hours. And arriving back home in time for dinner with your family may not always happen. But it's all worth while when you see how much the patients are progressing from visit to visit.

I have made trips with numerous nobles, all of them great volunteers. But recently we have lost two hard working roadrunners. I didn't start my road running career until my retirement a couple years ago. One of the first nobles I traveled with was Paul Hoover, who recently passed away. One of the trips in the not too distant past was with Barrie Wyland who died recently as the result of a farming accident. Two great nobles gone from our group.

Some of our group have been at it for a long time and logged thousands of miles, and now find the need to slow down. We are looking for some new recruits. We do meet as a group several times a year to discuss the "business" of our organization. We meet at Jaffa usually on a Saturday morning and after the informational meeting and discussions, we have lunch. And to show our ladies how much we appreciate their support of our efforts, we have a ladies night.

Up through the middle of September we have tal vans and the Indiana County made 44 trips to Philadelphia, 46 trips to Erie and 4 trips to Cincinnati, logging approximately 33,000 miles. We do need some help.



Temple, Unit, and Shrine Club Officers

Installation with Traditional Feast to follow

Imperial Council Bylaws require that the following extract from Article 25 be published in the notice sent to the membership.

The first seven officers of the temple are the Potentale, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer and Recorder. 325.2 (a) The first seven officers shall be elected annually by ballot and constitute the Official Divan.

325.4 Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January.

325.5 Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.

325.6 Balloting must commence no later than 9:00 PM and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.

325.8 Candidates for Officers and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor. Nominating committees are prohibited.

325.10 (a) When a temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.

(b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.

(c) A majority vote of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.

(d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.

(e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.

(f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(g) Blank ballots are not counted.

325.11 (a) The printing, publication, circulation or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets or other devices, by a Noble, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the Temple is prohibited.

(b) For any violation of (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(c) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election the Temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

The Imperial Council Law requires that you have your current year dues card in order that you may attend the meeting.

Continuing its tradition of innovative and collaborative care, Shriners Hospitals for Children surgeons are part of a collaborative team of experts performing this complex, life-changing surgery

Shriners Hospitals for Children® joined a collaborative team of 40 medical experts from Philadelphia, PA to perform the world's first bilateral hand transplant on a child. Earlier this month, surgeons successfully transplanted donor hands and forearms onto 8-year-old Zion Harvey, who at the age of 2 underwent amputation of his hands and feet following a serious infection.

Chief of Staff, Scott Kozin, M.D. and Dan Zlotolow, M.D from Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia initially evaluated Zion as a possible recipient of the first pediatric hand transplant. Zion, who had previously received a kidney transplant from his mother, was already taking anti-rejection drugs, which made him a strong candidate for this procedure.

"This historic case demonstrates our commitment to innovative pediatric care that truly transforms the life of a child," said Jerry Gantt, Chairman of the Board of Directors for Shriners Hospitals for Children. "Our mission is to help children achieve their dreams. Giving Zion the opportunity to one day climb monkey bars and throw a football is just another way we send Love to the rescue®."



To perform this complex procedure, Shriners Hospitals for Children partnered with Children's Hospital of Pennsylvania, Penn Medicine and Gift of Life. Drs. Kozin and Zlotolow formed part of a 40-person team during the nearly 11-hour procedure to attach donor hands and forearms to Zion. Four teams of doctors worked to secure first the bones, then the arteries and veins, muscles, tendons and nerves.

"The collaboration between these institutions was necessary to assemble the team and organize the players to orchestrate such a complex and demanding procedure that had never been performed on a child," stated Scott H. Kozin, M.D., chief of staff for Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia.

Doctors expect Zion to gain full use of his new hands and achieve his dream to throw a football and climb on monkey bars.
