



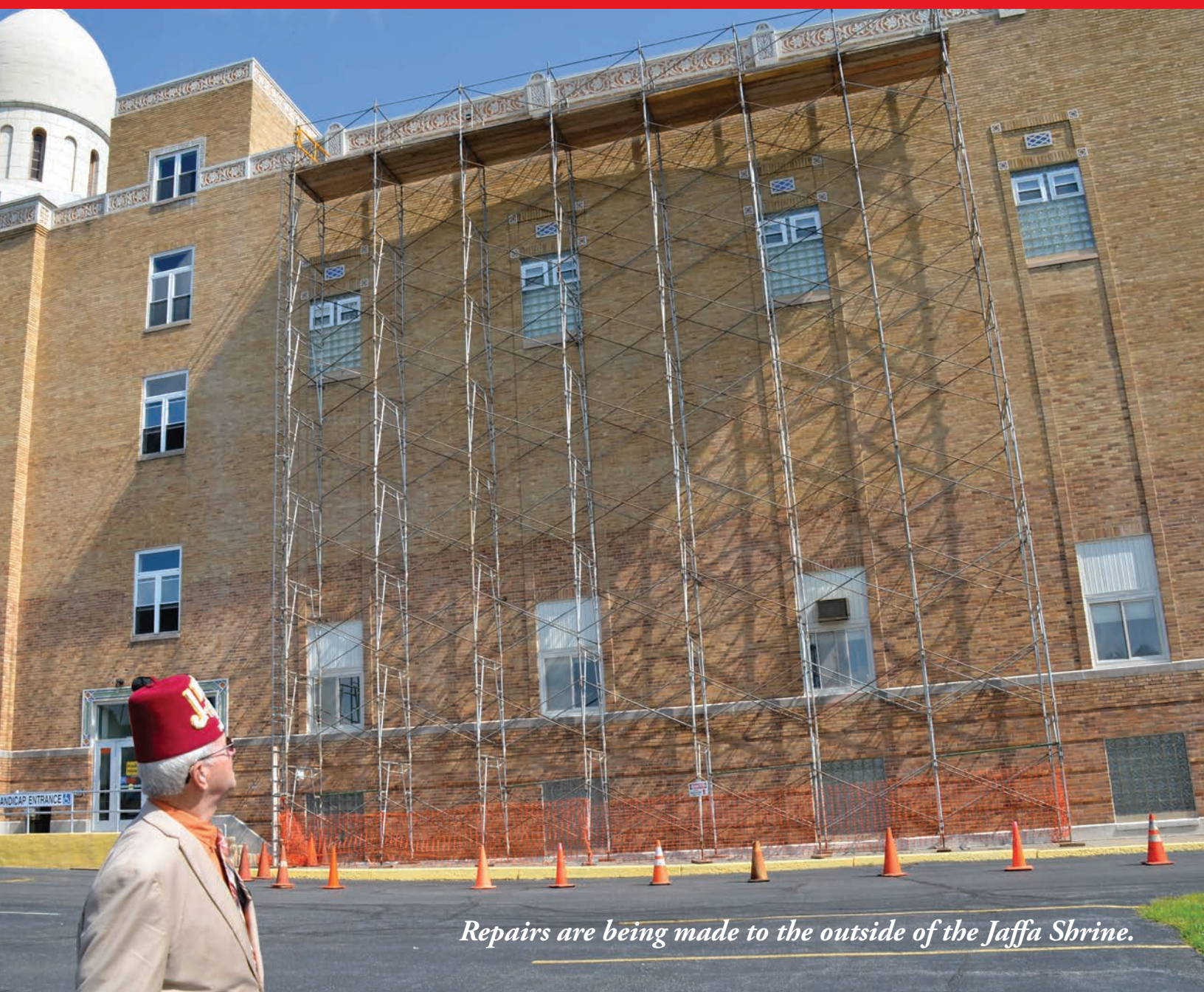

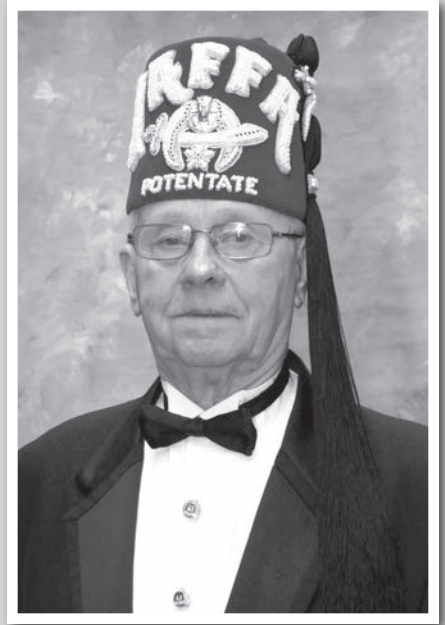

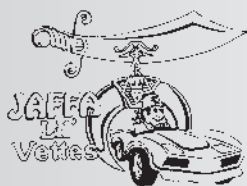
MOUNTED PATROL

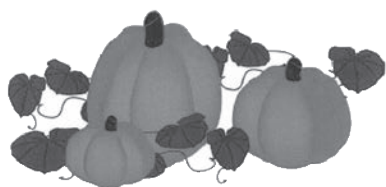

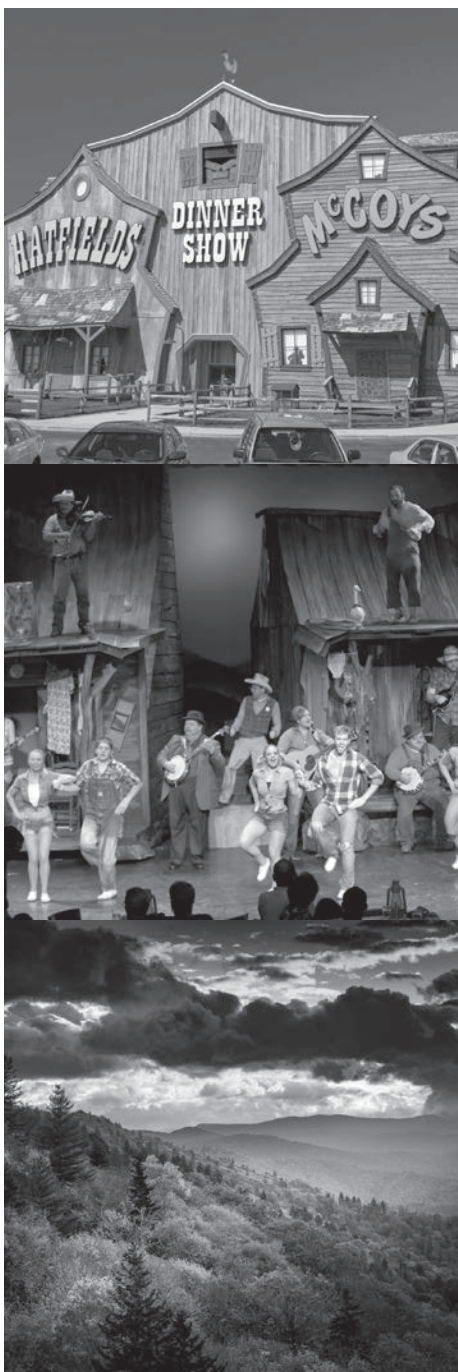
