

Scott Kozin, M.D., presented the Dr. Audrey E. Evans Award of Excellence

The city of Philadelphia is known for having a full history of firsts.



The first art museum, university, medical school, zoo, escalator, department store, U.S. Mint, and the list could go on about all of the first places and things that have occurred in the great city of Brotherly Love. Philadelphia is also home to the world's first Ronald McDonald House. Co-founded by Audrey Evans, M.D. (a pediatric oncologist at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia) and Jimmy Murray (former general manager of the Philadelphia Eagles), the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House opened on October 15, 1974 and now serves as the model for over 350 Houses in 42 countries.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia has had a long-standing relationship with the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House at the Front and Erie location, where many of our patients stay. This year, the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House charities introduced its Champions of Hope Awards, which highlights

other local individuals that embody the same dream, determination and commitment to children and families as the co-founders, Dr. Audrey Evans and Jim Murray.

The inaugural event chose to honor Scott Kozin, M.D., chief of staff, Philadelphia Shriners Hospital, with the Dr. Audrey E. Evans Award of Excellence. The Jim Murray Community Leadership Award went to Suzanne Root, Esq.

Here is an excerpt of the speech that Dr. Kozin gave at the Champions of Hope Awards Dinner:

It is a privilege and honor to receive the Audrey Evans Award of Excellence tonight. Shriners Hospitals for Children and Ronald McDonald House are a perfect symbiotic relationship. We are all stronger by collaboration. Collaboration allows us to care for more children, better their lives and maintain family unity. Our relationship with Ronald McDonald house has grown over the last 20 years. Our hospital here in Philadelphia cares for children from around the United States and the globe. Notably, last year we cared for children from 48 out of the 50 states. The ability for us to care for these children could not be possible without the facilities and care at the Ronald McDonald House. Time has resulted in many changes in health care that make it increasingly difficult to keep patients in the hospital. Daily, weekly and monthly we search for alternative housing during their stay in Philadelphia. Surgery is just part of the treatment with rehabilitation being equally important. Many of our patients are severely impaired and require intensive rehabilitation before and after

surgery. It is unpractical for them to fly back and forth or drive back and forth hours and hours to and from their home to Philadelphia. Housing them in Ronald McDonald House, a place filled with love and compassion, is the perfect solution for children and for their families.

Children and families' experiences at the Ronald McDonald House are remarkable and memorable. The families are indebted to the care and compassion demonstrated in the area. Families have become friends at the Ronald McDonald House and frequently coordinate their stays at the house so that their children and they can be more comfortable and cared for during their treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children. None of this could have been possible without the drive and vision of Dr. Evans.

In closing, I am humbled by receiving this award. I'm indebted to Dr. Evans for her care and treatment of children with neuroblastoma and for her vision to see the Ronald McDonald House as a valuable respite home for children with complex medical diagnoses to heal both on the outside and on the inside.

What's New in Erie!

Former Patient Lives Un-limb-ited Life



Richard "Lucas" Slusher was born without a forearm below his right elbow. As a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie, Lucas learned the skills and resolve necessary to lead a full and active life.

The staff members at the Erie Medical Center inspired Lucas, now 23 years old, to give back. This journey began when he was 17 with a flyer he received advertising the Un-Limb-ited Amputee Camp in Park City, Utah. The camp is coordinated by Shriners Hospitals for Children – Salt Lake City.

The Great Outdoors

The camp gives children, ages 13 to 17 who have a limb deficiency, the opportunity to learn skiing and snowboarding or to experience whitewater river sports like kayaking, canoeing and rafting, as well as

camping. One of the camp's missions is to help the teenagers better understand how to use their prosthetics through sports. Lucas was excited by the camp's mission, so he wrote an essay and completed the application process. He was selected to attend the camp. He says his experience was spectacular.

Prior to attending the Un-Limbited Camp, Lucas had never had the opportunity to interact with other kids who were missing a limb or even travel somewhere as far as Utah. It was enlightening for him to see how other children approached their challenges. Lucas now volunteers at the same camp and shares his love of the outdoors with teens who may be facing some of the same challenges as he did.

Never Giving Up

Lucas credits the people around him – his family and the medical staff at SHC – Erie – for being his biggest motivation. He was raised to do his best at everything, never make excuses and never give up. One piece of advice that he has for anyone facing obstacles in life is to "Have faith in yourself and reach out to others. Open up to someone. Never doubt yourself."

Throughout his life, Lucas has used a body-powered prosthesis. More recently, Lucas was fitted with a myoelectric prosthetic, which uses existing muscles in the upper arm to control the wrist, hand and elbow. Lucas hopes that further progress in technology will one day allow him to use a more advanced prosthetic arm.

Lucas is currently finishing his studies at Kent State University and expects to graduate in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in applied communications. He recently completed an internship with WJET-TV 24 (Erie's ABC affiliate) and really enjoyed writing stories and reporting. He hopes to follow that career path upon graduation.

SHC — Erie Launches Campaign for New EOS Imaging Technology



SHC – Erie has launched a major fundraising campaign to purchase an EOS imaging system.

EOS is a revolutionary imaging system that captures whole body images of a standing or sitting patient in a single scan, using up to 91% less radiation than x-ray. Radiation dose received during repeated x-rays is a risk factor for cancer later in life, particularly with many of our patients being treated for conditions such as scoliosis, that require multiple x-rays throughout childhood.

What's New in Erie!

The new EOS imaging system will enhance SHC – Erie's ability to continue providing the highest quality care to children with musculoskeletal conditions and other special health care needs.

The cost of bringing this advanced technology to the Erie medical center is estimated at \$1,012,500. Since initiation of the campaign, more than \$328,000 has been secured. Shrine temples are invited and encouraged to help make this project a reality by supporting our fundraising efforts to bring this state-of-the-art technology to our medical center.
