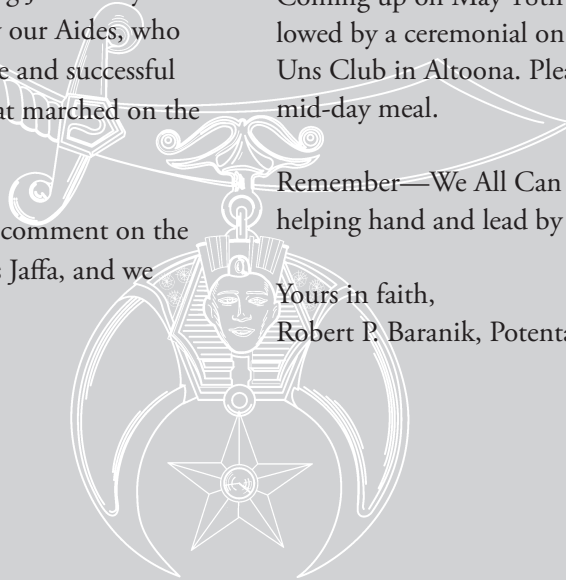

HOUSING POLICIES

1. All reservations must be made directly through your Unit/Club Housing Representative. This includes details on your stay and any guests that may accompany you.
2. Each room includes two MASA Registrations. Additional registrations may be purchased at the cost listed above. All nobles must be registered to parade. The entire Temple may be disqualified from the parade if it is found a noble doesn't possess an active dues card and a registration badge.
3. This year you may pay by credit card at the office. Please instruct the administrator to notify the unit and the MASA Housing Committee of your payment. Please retain all receipts until the end of October in case an error is made. You will still be responsible to register with your unit.
4. All units are responsible for deposit and final payment costs. A deposit of \$100 per room is due at the office by June 1st, 2018. Final payments are due at the office by August 3rd, 2018. If either payment is late an additional cost of \$100 will be assessed to the unit.
5. Cancellations may be made prior to August 3rd without charge. Any cancellation after August 3rd, the party will be responsible for any registration fees. Cancellations after August 17th, the party will be responsible for any registration fees and a single night stay (\$130.00). Any reservation that does not check in at their scheduled time or does not contact the MASA Housing Committee will be responsible for any registration fees and a single night stay (\$130.00). All changes and cancellations must be made through a member of the MASA Housing Committee after August 3rd.
6. Members of the Elected Divan, Chief Aide, Executive Aide, and Personal Aide will register through the office. Past Potentates may register through the office or your unit. Registration through your unit means you will be lodged at the hotel your unit is assigned. Individuals not a member of a unit may register at the office and they will be assigned a hotel room sometime after June 1st.
7. Check-in time must adhere to hotel policy. Any additional charges incurred will be billed to the noble. The hotels have been instructed to not accept any check-ins on a day prior to the scheduled day.



Jaffa Shrine Legacy Program: Strengthening our Fraternal Bonds

Our Legacy story relates to a very unique family of Shriners which includes two past potentates, a MASA Director and President and five brothers who have all contributed to the success and growth of our Jaffa Shrine, Altoona PA. This impressive Shrine family has a collective total of 331 years of service to our Shrine. It is also noteworthy that when the youngest brother became a Shriner in 1967, they became the only family in U.S. Shrinedom to have a father and five sons belonging to the same temple at the same time. I proudly present the Meadows family of Shriners; all six members are pictured together with the Potentate from Cairo Temple.

Our story starts with the father Delbert V Meadows, a dedicated and innovative business leader who joined our shrine in the early 1950's and became an active member of the greeters Unit. Together with his father James V Meadows 1st and brother Richard S Meadows started the J.V. Meadows & Sons Enterprises. They all started as farmers and in 1938 started the Meadows Scrapple Business which, is still produced today by the Kunzler Meat Co. in Tyrone PA where Richard's son Bradley is employed as a Plant Supervisor. In 1950 J.V. Delbert and Richard started the Meadows Original Custard business in Hollidaysburg, and added the Golf Driving Range in 1952. Today Richard, Jay and Joel, all sons of Delbert own the business we know today.

In the 1960's Delbert became active in Jaffa and was elected to the Divan and rose to the office of Illustrious Potentate in 1967. He later became President of MASA.

He with Jaffa approval changed the Circus from Hamid Morton to the Ian Garden Circus. He orchestrated how the

concessions were handled and sold by the Jaffa. He also used his own Scrapple trucks to travel to Philadelphia to pick up extra toys and concessions when supplies were low and was also accepted into the Jesters.

Delbert's sons James V II and Richard L. became Shriners in 1958 They both joined the Jaffa Band, Jim as a drummer and Dick as a trombone player. After several years the two brothers were instrumental in forming and performing with the Clown Unit. In the 1980s they formed the Highlanders. Today at age 81 Dick is still an Honorary member of the Band, Clowns and Highlanders.

Delbert (Mac) Meadows the 3rd son joined Jaffa in 1962 and joined the Patrol and later rose to become Captain. Jay I. Meadows the 4th son joined in 1964 and joined the Drum and Bugle Corp. as a Trumpeter.

In 1967 Joel C. the 5th son joined and was active in shrine duties. James V. Delbert's first son was elected to the Divan

in the late 60's and rose to become the second member of the family to become Potentate in 1974.

The entire Meadows family have always been active in our Shrine and community and all 5 brothers were members of Hollidaysburg Jaycees helping and orchestrating projects in the Hollidaysburg area. One of the projects during the Jaycee Presidency of Richard was the Star on top of Chimney Rocks, seen every Christmas season. The original Star was built by their grandfather JV Meadows. The first 2 years there was no electricity so they would take turns at night keeping gas in a generator to keep the star lit.

Being a Shriner is a way of life for the Meadows family and their collective efforts to grow our shrine by introducing new Nobles, supporting our various programs and events have made this family an invaluable part of our Shrine. Thank you.
