

# Meet the JAFFA SHRINE HIGHLANDERS

Below is a brief biography of some of the members of the Jaffa Shrine Highlanders. The band was founded by a group of Jaffa nobles in May, 1977. The band chose the tartan of the Gordon Highlanders of the British Army which it still wears today. Information about additional members will be included in a following issue. The band sponsors an annual Robert Burns Dinner in January of each year to which all are invited. Feel free to talk to any of our members if you are interested in either the dinner or the bagpipes or the drums.

**ROB VONADA** has been a member of the Jaffa Highlanders since 1990. A drummer in high school and college, Rob learned to play the pipes so he didn't have to carry the bass drum. The Jaffa Highlanders are pipers to law enforcement, public safety and veterans' organizations in the greater Altoona area and Rob performs annually at Memorial Day Services and at the Blair County Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Service.

**ROBBIE VONADA** officially joined the Highlanders in 2016 after playing drums in the unit for many years in non-shrine events. Robbie is an alumni of the Hollidaysburg High School drum line. He graduated from Liberty University and is employed as an Assistant Program Director at the Blair Regional YMCA.

**DONNIE VONADA** joined the Highlanders in 2016 and participated bearing the rampant lion banner. The Jaffa Highlanders welcome all prospective pipers and drummers into the unit as a member of the color guard. Donnie moved to the drum line on the tenor drum in 2018. He is a graduate of Liberty University and is employed with the Adelphoi organization.

**CASEY FLAHERTY** is entering his 10th year as a high school social studies teacher. He is very recently married to his perfect match. Though he originally began learning the pipes years ago, frequent hiatuses eventually led him to officially joining the Highlanders in early 2018 where he has since enjoyed musicianship, fellowship, and top-notch camaraderie.

**JOHN MACMILLEN** is the appointed pipe sergeant. That means he is compelled to listen to everything the pipe major says good or bad. Mac is our resident shrink; a psycho ceramic (crack pot) by trade and joined the band in 2003. A veteran himself and retired police officer he plays those events in addition to the band performances.

Growing up, **MATT EVANS** started into music playing the piano in kindergarten all through his years of school, as well as violin from fourth grade and on. # 144th Annual Imperial Session DAYTONA BEACH | JULY 15-19, 2018

Representatives of Jaffa attended the Shriners Imperial Session in Daytona Beach, Florida, led by Illustrious Sir Robert Baranik and Lady Sue. All elected Jaffa representatives of the Iowa and Colorado Corporations attended all sessions. Chief Aide, Scott Woomer and Lady Amy along with Executive Aide, Ryan Baranaik provided excellent hospitality to our representatives and guest.

Once again the Walk for Love was held at the Daytona International Speedway. Jaffa was well represented and a good time was had by all. Later in the afternoon a church service was held in the Peabody Auditorium followed by the public opening of the Imperial Session held at the Daytona Beach Ocean Center.

Monday morning started with the usual formalities then it was time to get to the business of the session. A total of 46 items were on the agenda for passage or rejection. The first item on the agenda was to vote on allowing electronic balloting to be permitted. After discussion the member voted in favor and electronic devices were used.

A few highlights of the voting were the decisions on four hospitals. Twin Cities, located in Minnesota, the Cincinnati Burns Hospital and The Tampa Hospital will be authorized to decide on relocating if the Board of Governors of each facility

and the Board of Directors and Trustees of Shriners Hospitals for Children deems a decision is necessary and appropriate. These actions passed. The Boston Shriners Hospital is requesting a moratorium be placed on any changes in location or in services currently provided at Boston Shriners Hospital while negations occur with Massachusetts General Hospital. This action failed.

In other actions, Nemesis Shriners in Parkersburg, WV withdrew from the Mid Atlantic Shrine Association.

Two New Shrine Centers were chartered. Amal Shriners located in Sao Paulo, Brazil and Bolivia Shriners in Bolivia, South America.

Election of Officers was held on Tuesday afternoon. All current Imperial Officers were elected to the next office, then it was time for the election of the new Imperial Outer Guard. Nominators for Mark E. Hartz of Boumi Shriners and Joe Schloss of Kalif Shriners gave their speeches and after voting, Mark E. Hartz was elected to the position.

Wednesday was the public installation of the Imperial Potentate elect, Jim Cain. Imperial Sir and Lady Patsy being from Nashville entered the arena in a pick-up truck to the theme of County Roads. In the afternoon session, guests were introduced the new patient ambassadors.

Lily, age 18, from Paducah, Kentucky, was born with fibular hemimelia, meaning she did not have a fibula, the outer thin bone that runs from the knee to the ankle, in her right leg. She underwent a Syme's amputation, which is an amputation done through the ankle joint that helps to preserve the heel pad, and she received her first prosthesis a few months later.

Riley, now age 17, was born with the genetic condition hereditary multiple exostoses (HME), which causes irregular bone growth. Exostoses are more commonly known as "bone spurs," which typically grow on the end of long bones during childhood and adolescence. In Riley's case, physicians discovered growths from nearly head to toe through a full body x-ray when he was 14 months old.

Thursday, dawned the final day of the session and with all legistaltion finished, the installation of Imperil Officers was held. After closing remarks by Imperial Sir Jim Cain, the Imperial Session was adjourned until next year in Nashville, TN.




