

ROAD RUNNERS

The Jaffa Road Runners will again be selling fresh cut Christmas trees beginning Black Friday. Before we can start selling them, we must take delivery, and that will be the day before Happy Bird Day.

Since most of our Road Runners are retired, we depend on younger nobles to help handle the big trees, and this year it was from the Mounted Patrol and anyone else who happened to be available at 8am.

We have a good selection of fir, blue spruce and pine. Trees up to 12 feet are \$40 and over that are \$50, and delivery is available. The first load will include a dozen 12 foot blue spruce for delivery to the Cathedral and some large ones for the Stuckey dealerships.

The trees are fresh cut the day before delivery in Lehigh Valley, Pennsylvania, so we get the very freshest. A second delivery will be about the second week in December, again fresh cut the day before delivery. The tree lot will be open Monday through Friday from 3pm until 8pm, Saturdays from 10am until 5pm, and Sundays from noon until 5pm. Delivery is available for a fee.

I love taking the trips to the four Shrine hospitals in our area. Most of my trips are to Philadelphia, but I have also been to Boston, Cincinnati and Erie. Of the 60+ trips to date, most have been to Philadelphia.

They have the biggest and best selection of food in the cafeteria, and when they have when nothing on the menu to our liking, we head downtown a couple hundred feet for a REAL Philly Cheese Steak Sandwich with Cheese Whiz.

As I previously mentioned, most of our drivers are retired, and we are still looking for some additional drivers who may have just retired and looking to get a break from the honey-do-list. If you are interested, you can call Dale Wills, our coordinator, at 814-943-1683 or Terri in the Jaffa Recorder's Office at 814-944-4043.

While the patients are being seen by the staff, we usually go the driver's lounge for a snooze in a recliner chair, and/or head to the cafeteria or sit in the lobby and talk to parents and visitors. I have met parents of patients from all over the world who go to Philadelphia Shriners Hospital because it is the very best.

P.S. Somehow we always seem to stop at the Shady Maple on the way home.




and one son-in-law becoming Master Masons and Jaffa Shriners was a moment that will not easily be forgotten. Kudos to all involved.

From injury to MVP

Derick is a young and talented multisport athlete who suffered a season ending ACL injury. He was evaluated at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie shortly after his injury. After testing and evaluation, it was determined that a surgical procedure was needed. Michael McClincy, MD performed an ACL reconstruction in November 2018.



Two weeks after his surgery, Derick began his physical therapy journey where he participated in a variety of activities twice weekly. Despite the length of Derick's rehabilitation, extent of his injury and operative procedure, his level of motivation never waivered. In an 11 year old's world, one year of rehabilitation can feel like a lifetime!

Derick's first objective test of functional ability was measured in the motion analysis center using the Biodex machine to assess his leg strength. The results were reviewed with Dr. McClincy, who cleared Derick for his first major victory of his journey: return to running. Derick

was also issued a sports brace to wear for all athletic activity. In the following months, Derick's rehabilitation grew more intense. Jumping, plyometrics and higher impact activities were initiated. Activities involving two feet became one-footed.

Derick's next major victory came at his nine month postoperative follow-up. Dr. McClincy reviewed Derick's testing results, and Derick was released to return to playing baseball, a sport with minimal contact and less pivoting motion, which is a common cause of re-injury. This victory came just in time, because Derick had plans to participate in an allstar baseball tournament that week. Derick was named the Baseball Youth Team MVP and overall tournament MVP for his age group!

Less than one year after surgery, Derick was cleared to playing sports again. The road through rehabilitation was not always smooth, however Derick's mother phrased it best: "You have helped transform what was a devastating experience into a constructive, growing experience. You pushed Derick beyond his limits and taught him how to physically and mentally overcome challenges. Because of your compassion and gentle approach, Derick does not fear returning to sports. In my book, that is priceless."

Family researched options for scoliosis care, found innovative fusionless option



Danika, or Dani as she prefers to be called, was diagnosed with scoliosis at the age of 9. Her parents, Steve and Kimberly, sought an orthopaedic

physician in the Washington, D.C. area. Danika was braced at 10 years old, but her curve progressed. Two years later, they were reading up on spine fusions and that is when they came across a Facebook support group about vertebral body tethering (VBT), an alternative to spine fusions.

An appointment was made in August 2018 to see Amer Samdani, M.D., chief of surgery at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia. The leader in completing VBT surgeries, Dr. Samdani provided Dani and her parents options for her spine care. After a few months, her curve increased, it was time to make a decision.

Danika was a prime candidate for VBT with a 41-degree curvature of the spine. Her surgery date was scheduled for September 2019. Little did Danika's family know during the planning of her surgical date that she would be the first patient to have the surgery post-FDA clearance, with a new device specifically for VBT. Although the procedure had been completed over 450 times before Danika's surgery, she was now the first to have the surgery with the new device.



The Tether™ is the first commercially available product used for anterior vertebral body tethering, a surgical procedure for certain patients with scoliosis who are still growing and for whom surgery is indicated.

"The ability to utilize a child's growth to correct the curve in their back is a leap in the way these children like Danika are treated. Properly selected patients can achieve curve correction while maintaining mobility," stated Dr. Samdani.

Danika fills her time with creating art pieces – she loves to paint. She also enjoys listening to music while painting. Besides painting, Danika enjoys traveling the country with her parents and sister. If Danika could tell her pre-surgery self something post-surgery, it would be "It is worth it."

Nerve transfer surgery helps improve patient's swim time During a short mountain bike trek last year, 15-year-old Olivia fell off her bike and severely damaged her arm.

Olivia's mom, Tara, took her to numerous doctors, each confirming that Olivia's injury had caused nerve damage to her shoulder and arm. They all said that the nerve damage was permanent and there was nothing they

could do. Not only would her pain never go away, but there was a chance her swimming career would be over.

Finally, one of the doctors suggested that Tara bring Olivia to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia. She recommended Scott Kozin, M.D., chief of staff, with the highest recommendation, saying, "If anyone can fix it, Dr. Kozin can."

Olivia underwent a nerve transfer surgery at the Philadelphia Shriners Hospital in October 2018, which improved her range of motion and ability tremendously. Olivia participated in swimming, cheerleading, soccer and was even a lifeguard. A month after her surgery, Olivia dropped 10 seconds off her backstroke time. She was now able to swim faster than she did before her accident.

Olivia wants others to know the doctors are amazing and always try to help. "My swimming was very important to me and it took a big hit when I got injured," said Olivia. "But after telling Dr. Kozin my desire to improve my swimming, and getting surgery, I can now swim better than I ever did before."
