I was able to attend my first Puerto Rico outreach clinic that is quarterbacked by Shriners Children's Philadelphia. We saw 298 kids in two days, each one a special story as are their parents. Many of them waited 4 to 6 hours to see one of our doctors with the hope of us being able to help their child. I didn't hear a single complaint-patience. One of my duties was to walk the families out of the clinic area to the check out and scheduling area. One of the mothers whose child is scheduled for an upcoming surgery in Philadelphia, asked for an interpreter. She wanted to know two things: (1) Was it okay to give me a hug? (2) Is this really true that Shriners is going to do this operation even though I can't pay for it? The answer to both of her questions was Si. Her tears of joy are why "we do what we do"-graciousness.

Lady Tracy and I would like to thank you for a memorable year. Your support and friendship are overwhelming. We plan to stay active with our Jaffa family hopefully for many years to come. Remember your Shriners creed, to support our temples of mercy with you "spirit, time, talent and means."





Changing the Game: Adaptive Sports

Adaptive sports, modified to fit the needs of the athlete, allow individuals to continue to do what they love.

Like many of our patients, Steven has grown up coming to Shriners Children's Philadelphia since the age of 5. He was diagnosed with transverse myelitis, a neurological disorder caused by inflammation to both sides of a section of the spinal cord. In Steven's situation, the inflammation occurred in his cervical spine.

Due to his condition, Steven has impaired strength and sensation throughout his arms and legs. This is defined as incomplete quadriplegia (tetraplegia).

After making the switch from playing wheelchair basketball three years ago, Steven began playing wheelchair rugby through the Magee Rehabilitation Program, and he has loved it ever since.



While he was a patient, Steven worked with our team of physical therapists, where sports -specific training was a part of his care plan.

"His goals were to get stronger for his sport and with his upper extremity strength and range of motion limitations; he needed the specialization/skill set of a physical therapist to adapt his strength training movements." Says, Christin Krey, PT, MPT, PCS.

"Ms. Christin was my therapist in my later years there, and she really set the tone and helped develop a workout schedule for back at home, which has paid off tons! Everyone

I've worked with was amazing. All of the therapists always found a way to mix in some fun with the work, which always made the session much more enjoyable and made me eager to work!" said Steven.

What is wheelchair rugby?

Wheelchair rugby is a contact sport played on a basketball court. Four players per team will be on the court at one time, and the goal is to take the volleyball from one end of the court to the other end within 40 seconds.*

Wheelchair Rugby Safety Tips:

- Take care of your hands and tape them up with protective tape, hand blisters are common.
- Rugby is an aerobic sport, practice endurance and work on cardio.
- Always make sure your sports chair is fitted correctly and secured safely. Most sports chairs will have straps and belts, some chairs may even include lap, foot and chest belts to keep players safe.

It is important to take safety precautions during the summer and all year round while participating in adaptive sports programs, and always consult your doctor before starting any new adaptive exercise program.

Enzo Gets Back in the Game

Enzo was born with bilateral **fibular hemimelia**, a rare birth defect where part of, or a patient's whole fibula in the leg, is missing.

He became a patient when he was 10 months old after his family learned that Shriners Children's was able to offer below-theknee amputation and a prosthesis to help Enzo improve his functional abilities.

Growing up with a prosthetic leg has not stopped Enzo, now 18, from doing anything that he loves. Whether this is through sports, video games, or playing with his two brothers, he has remained active and unstoppable. Within the past few years, he has grown to love the sport of basketball.



When he isn't coaching his younger brother's basketball team, or playing video games, he usually can be found playing a game of pickup basketball with his friends.

With traditional prosthetic feet, it can be challenging to play a sport, as they lack rotational and multi-axial movement, which ultimately places a lot of stress on the residual limb and knee joint. To improve his performance and comfort level while playing, Enzo was recently fit to receive a state-of-the-art high-activity foot with a torsion adapter. This was made possible thanks to the Timothy J. Piazza Foundation.

The Timothy J. Piazza Foundation was founded after Jim and Evelyn Piazza's son Tim tragically passed away in February 2017. They created the Timothy J. Piazza Memorial Foundation in his honor.

As stated on the foundation's website: "In order to fulfill Tim's life and career goals, and to give life to his legacy, his family and friends have established a foundation in Tim's memory to help others who are in need. The Timothy J. Piazza Memorial Foundation provides support to those who are in need of prosthetic devices."

"We chose this high-activity foot with a torsion module to allow additional rotational movement when pivoting and turning, and to absorb shock when landing from a jump. These features will not only improve Enzo's athletic performance but increase his comfort while playing." – Calli Clark, MSPO, CPO/L, Director of Orthotics and Prosthetics

With this new device, Enzo is looking forward to additional mobility when playing basketball, as well as finally being able to wear flip-flops. "I can wear flip-flops now!" he said.

Shriners Children's is so thankful for the generous support from the Timothy J. Piazza Memorial Foundation. Since 2018 they have granted over \$228,000 to the hospital. Their foundation raises money and awareness through various events including an annual golf tournament, where patients like Enzo have spoken to the crowd and shared their gratitude.

Enzo's senior year took a turn when he developed an infection after amputation revision surgery that he had in February 2022. He was out of school from November 2022 to March 2023, and returned to school with just enough time to attend his senior trip to Walt Disney World. Enzo is now an incoming college freshman.

Until his infection was fully healed, Enzo could not receive his new prosthetic. Still, Luis and Jen, two practitioners from the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) department, knew exactly what to do! They made a temporary prosthetic in-house so Enzo could enjoy his senior class trip. "Luis and Jen did everything they could to get him to Disney," said Andrea, Enzo's mother. To thank Luis and Jen, Enzo surprised them both with T-shirts that read, "My prosthetist made my trip."

Enzo and his family are incredibly grateful to Shriners Children's and the care provided to them. "Words cannot describe how grateful we are. Whenever you call, someone is always there. It's wonderful," said Andrea.



Dear Nobles, Brethren, and Potential Candidates within the 20th Masonic District and beyond,

With the One Day Masonic Journey in March there are some points of interest I would like to share with you. All petitions are to be handled in the traditional way, read one month, laid over for investigation and balloted on the following month. All petitions will need acted upon no later than the March Stated Meetings. That means you will need your petitions turned in by February Stated Meeting! If you have a candidate from a different Masonic District, you will need the permission of your District Deputy Grand Master and they will in turn contact Lawrence J. Bilotto, District Deputy Grand Master of the 20th Masonic District or myself after my installation as District Deputy Grand Master on January 7th.

The Lodge Secretary will be responsible for registering your Lodge's candidates that day. If for any reason he is unable to attend that day you will need to have someone fill in for him and perform the duties that day. Sign in sheets and candidate packets will already be there. The Lodge Secretary will be responsible for entering the candidate's information after final confirmation received from the Coordinator that he was present for all degrees.

The candidate will need to bring an approval letter with him to the Jaffa Shrine. The Lodge Secretary should make a copy and take it with him just in case a candidate forgets it. I'm sure it will happen to someone. In our Lodge we are inviting the candidates and their mentors to our Brother's Breakfast to inform them what is going happen that day, what he will need to gain entrance (Approval letter & Photo I.D.) and how to dress. A meeting like this can be held at your Lodge's convenience and would be a good idea. The Grand Master requires one mentor for a candidate. There is a place on the approval letter for the mentor's name.

The mentors will be instructed on the steps, signs and grips and words. The mentor's instruction will be between each degree in the 21st Lounge. Additionally there will be instruction provided at the 20th Masonic District, School of Instruction.

After the Masonic Ritual, by a waiver from the Right Worshipful Grand Master, a new member may join the Valley of Altoona, Scottish Rite and/or Jaffa Shriners. The Rite of the Road program planned allows you to join Scottish Rite in very little time.

As a member you may be asking what you can do to help. Please go to your lodge's February Stated Meeting and let your Secretary know that you would like help with the One Day Class. I imagine all the lodges are scrambling to find mentors. This is the must go to Masonic Event of the year. There will be a luncheon available and a dinner after the Scottish Rite and Shriners International rituals and ceremonies have completed.

Registration begins at 9:00 AM on Saturday Morning, March 23, 2024 at the Jaffa Shrine Center. Get out to your Lodges, see how you can help, and attend this event.

THE STATUE BY DEAN MCKNIGHT



It's not bronze; It's not stone; I really don't know what it's made from. I only know what it means to me. I pass this statue when I'm driving home and when I visit the majestic old building where it stands. It is a symbol to all who look its way. It is in fact called the "Editorial Without Words" and when you look at it you instantly see a man carrying a child who can't walk alone. But you also see that the man is a Shriner. A Shriner just like you and me. Well maybe not exactly like me. At my age the statue moves better than I do. I'm not the man with the child in his hands but I am the man with the pin on my lapel that says he was a Shriner just like me. Am I proud to wear that pin? You bet I am. Am I happy when I need a little help and another Shriner friend says "Can I help you?" You bet I am.

How about the pride you, like me, may feel when you see two of our Shriners Daniel Ramsey, and Mike Kessling on a TV show encouraging ticket sales to a Jaffa event. I admit they were not statues but one of them did freeze when the camera turned on him.

Pay attention to our Jaffa statue when you see it and put a smile of pride on your face. I'm sure there will never be a Dean McKnight statue in some park but it's OK. It's OK because that statue in front of our very own Jaffa Shrine building is a statue of me, and of you fellow Shriner. Put on your fez, stand in front of the mirror, and throw out your chest. 


